General Rules

1. This Standard Flower Show conforms to the standards established by National Garden Clubs, Inc (NGC). *Handbook for Flower Shows*, Revised 2017, with revisions printed in *The National Gardener* magazine (TNG), is the authority for all issues not covered by the Schedule which is the "Law of the Show".
2. All classes are open to any amateur gardener or designer. Entry cards are available from Dottie Howatt at dehowatt@aol.com or 302-235-1462.
3. Plants on the DE Department of Natural Resources Rare Vascular Plant List, www.dnrec.state.de.us/FW/RAREPLANT2001.HTM, may not be exhibited in any Division unless grown by the exhibitor or obtained in a legal manner and noted on a 3"x 5" card with exhibit. Plants on the DE Department of Natural Resources list of Invasive Plants, www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw/invasive.htm, may not be exhibited in any Division. Exceptions: Bamboo and wisteria vine, either dried, treated or in a non-reproductive stage, may be used in the Design Division and the Botanical Arts Design section.
4. All exhibits in the Horticulture Division must be fresh. No artificial plant material is allowed in any Division.
5. Entries will be received on Sunday, October 18, 2020 from 2- 4:30 pm. All exhibits must stay in place until 3:30 pm on Tuesday, October 20, 2020. All exhibits must be removed by 4 pm on Tuesday, October 20, 2020.
6. Exhibitors or another designated person are responsible for collecting their ribbons, awards and exhibits. Entries, ribbons, and awards not claimed by the owner or a designated person will become the property of DFGC.
7. All entries must be passed by the appropriate Classification Chairman before the exhibitor leaves the show floor. The Classification Chairman will check exhibits for conformity to the schedule.
8. Judging will begin on Sunday, October 18, 2020 at 6:00 pm. The General Flower Show Chairman and Classification Chairman for each Division will be available during judging for consultation. These chairmen, clerks, and the judges are the only personnel allowed on the show floor during judging. The decisions of the judges are final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
9. DFGC will strive to assure the safety of all items but is not responsible for any loss or damage.
10. *Handbook for Flower Shows*, Revised 2017 will be abbreviated in the schedule as HB.

AWARDS

National Garden Clubs, Inc. Placement Ribbons

The National Garden Club, Inc. (NGC) Standard System of Awarding is used in all divisions. Per class or subclass, only one first place blue ribbon scoring 90 points or more, only one second place red ribbon scoring 85 points or more, only one third place yellow ribbon scoring 80 points or more and one or more honorable mention white ribbon(s) scoring 75 points or more may be awarded as merited. All non-blue ribbons scoring 90 plus points must be so designated on the entry card and signed and dated by an NGC Accredited Judge on the judging panel.

National Garden Clubs, Inc. Top Exhibitor Awards

Horticulture Division Award

Award of Horticultural Excellence, HB p. 40, Division Award: rosette of green, orange, and blue ribbons. May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner of 95 points or more, correctly named, entered by a single exhibitor and judged to be the finest in the entire Horticulture Division. Eligible Division I.

Horticulture Section Award

Growers Choice, HB p.46, Section Award: rosette of dark green ribbons. May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner of 95 points or more, correctly named in sections of container grown plants (single, self-multiple or combination planting). Eligible Sections A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L.

Design Division Award

Award of Design Excellence, HB p. 42, Division Award: rosette of gold ribbons. May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner of 95 points or more in the entire Design Division entered by an individual. Eligible Division II.

Design Section Awards

Designer's Choice Award, HB p. 42, Section Award: rosette of purple ribbons. May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner of 95 points or more, entered by one individual in a designated section in which plant material used in the design may be dried, treated dried and /or fresh. Eligible Section M

Table Artistry Award, HB p. 43, Section Award: rosette of burgundy ribbons. May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner of 95 points or more, entered by one individual in designated sections of Functional or Exhibition Tables. Eligible Section N.

Education Section Award

Educational Top Exhibitor Award, HB p. 43, Section Award: rosette of brown and white ribbons. May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner of 95 points or more in the Education Division. A minimum of two eligible exhibits designed to educate the public about NGC goals/objectives are required to give the award. Eligible Section O.

Botanical Arts Artistic Crafts Section Award

Botanical Arts Artistic Crafts Award, HB p.44, Section Award: rosette of navy-blue ribbons. May be awarded to highest scoring blue ribbon winner scoring 95 points or more, entered by one individual in a designated section of Botanical Arts Artistic Crafts using some plant material. Eligible Section P.

Division I Horticulture Rules

1. Only well-groomed disease and pest free specimens of exhibition quality will be accepted.
2. The NGC Exhibit Policies for Horticulture are as follows, HB p. 55.
 - a. All exhibits must be fresh.
 - b. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor.
 - c. Plant material must be in its natural state and may not be altered by the application of oil, commercial shine products, etc. that change the natural appearance. No wiring or staking of specimens is permitted with the exception of orchids. Orchids bloom stems may have inconspicuous supports/ties/clips.
 - d. Plants whose natural growth has been altered such as grafted cacti, "lucky bamboo", braided stems and bonsai etc. will not be accepted.
 - e. All plant materials must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least the approximate number of days as follows: Houseplants - 90 days. Combination Plantings, except Troughs - 6 weeks. Container (woody ornamentals) and Troughs - 6 months.
3. Rules for exhibiting container grown specimens are listed in the HB and/or its supplement *Horticulture Exhibiting and Judging*.
4. Hangers on hanging plant containers must be removed by exhibitor.
5. All entries are to be named by currently accepted scientific designation or binomial name (genus, specific, epithet) and/or variety or patented/trademarked name. Consult HB, Chapter 6. In order to receive an NGC Top Exhibitor Award, the entry must be completely and correctly identified.
6. All exhibitors must have an exhibitor number. This number will be assigned at the Classification Table. Each exhibit must have an entry card. Cards may be obtained by emailing Dottie Howatt at dehowatt@aol.com. Cards are to be filled out in advance, if possible, using waterproof ink or address labels. See HB p.57 for a correctly filled out entry card.
7. If a plant is considered a flowering plant it should be exhibited as a flowering plant. Foliage plants may flower, but should be exhibited as a foliage plant if they are grown for their leaves.
8. Specimens with a class designation in the schedule may not be entered in an "any other class".
9. A horticulture exhibitor may make as many entries per class as they wish as long as each entry is a different genus, species, variety, cultivar, color, form or size.
10. The Classification Chairmen are free to subdivide classes by color, form size, cultivar, variety or other distinguishing characteristics.
11. The Scale of Points for Horticulture is printed in the HB p. 129-130.

Containers, with the exception of troughs, must be unadorned plastic, ceramic or clay unless noted in section/class. Maximum diameter of container (measured from inside pot rims) no more than 8". Containers with drain holes must have a matching saucer, clear plastic plate or clear plastic saucer.

Socialites Eligible for the Grower's Choice Award

Section L - Combination Plantings

A grouping of plants with similar cultural requirements such as light, water and humidity. Each plant to be labeled with a number. Corresponding numbers with botanical names to be typed or printed on a 3"x 5" card and placed with exhibit. No fairy gardens or fairy garden type accessories allowed. Naturalistic accessories limited to real wood and stone and must be in scale with the plants.

71. Indoor Planter - A grouping of plants in an unadorned indoor container. Plants to fit snugly together without crowding. Max. width or length 12".
72. Indoor Dish Garden - Miniature landscape in an open low volume shallow unadorned container. Max. width or length 12".

73. Terrarium - A miniature landscape in a container with high transparent sides. The top may be open or closed. Desertarium (cacti and/or succulents) a "desert type" terrarium is also allowed. No size limit on terrariums.
74. Trough - A miniature naturalistic landscape planting in a container designed to withstand year- round outdoor conditions. Size limited to 14" in any dimension. Exhibitor to place trough on show table after being classified.

Division II Design Rules

1. The NGC Policies and Guidelines for Design are as follows, HB p.79-80
 - a. Some fresh and/or dried plant material must be used in every exhibit.
 - b. Exhibitors may enter multiple classes in the Design Division, but may enter only one exhibit per class.
 - c. An exhibit entered for competition must be the work of one individual.
 - d. If the designer is unable to fill the assignment, it is the designer's responsibility to provide a substitute and notify the Design Entries Chairman.
 - e. If unable to transport or set up a completed design, a substitute may enter the design for the designer. This is only permitted for completed designs.
 - f. A single flower is not a design. Container-grown plants are permitted where appropriate but are never considered floral designs nor are they permitted in floral designs.
 - g. Landscapes and scenes or anything representing an actual item of clothing, person, animal, etc., are not acceptable.
 - h. Religious symbols must be displayed respectfully.
 - i. All plant material used in the design must be listed on a white, unlined 3"x5" card placed with the exhibit.
2. All entries must be pre-registered by contacting the Design Entries Chairman listed not later than October 1, 2020. Design entry card will be completed in advance by the Design Entries Chairman.
3. A description of plant material and non-plant material permitted and not permitted are found in HB pp 80-81. No artificial flowers, fruit, foliage or vegetables allowed. Artificial is defined as imitation or manufactured to appear as real material. Fresh plant material may never be treated in any manner.
4. Plant material need not be grown by the exhibitor and may be obtained from any legal source.
5. Designer has the freedom to choose traditional or creative type with any design listed unless restricted by the schedule, class or type award.
6. Exhibitor is required to conform to the stated description and limitations of the design type if named in the class. Rules for design types and advanced designs are printed in the HB Ch. 7.
7. Designer is on his/her honor that the design being entered has not been previously entered or judged in an NGC state, district or club flower show.
8. The Scale of Points for judging design is printed in the HB p.130.

Class 75. Are We There Yet? - Roadside Treats and Treasures

A design type of exhibitor's choice. Staged in a space 32" wide x 30" deep on a 30" high table. Viewed from the front. Staging panel and underlay optional and provided by the exhibitor. Exhibitor to provide support mechanics for staging panel.

Class 76. Bag and Baggage - The Perfect Wardrobe and Accessories

A design type of exhibitor's choice. Staged in a space 32" wide x 30" deep on a 30" high table. Viewed from the front. Staging panel and underlay optional and provided by the exhibitor. Exhibitor to provide support mechanics for staging panel.

Class 77. Roommates - "BFF"(maybe....)

A design type of exhibitor's choice. Staged in a space 32" wide x 30" deep on a 30" high table. Viewed from the front. Staging panel and underlay optional and provided by the exhibitor. Exhibitor to provide support mechanics for staging panel.

Friends, Food and Fun Eligible for Table Artistry Award

Section N

No cut fruit or vegetables. No open beverages. Limited dry processed food allowed. Processed food not considered as required plant material. Fresh fruits, nuts and vegetables allowed and are acceptable required plant material.

Class 78. Sip, Savor, Repeat - Cocktail Hour

An Exhibition Table HB p. 76. Staged in a space 32" wide x 30" deep on a 30" high table. Viewed from the front. Staging panel and underlay optional and provided by the exhibitor. Exhibitor to provide support mechanics for staging panel.

Class 79. The Great Escape - A Garden Tour with a Box/Bag Lunch

An Exhibition Table HB p. 76. Staged in a space 32" wide x 30" deep on a 30" high table. Viewed from the front. Staging panel and underlay optional and provided by the exhibitor. Exhibitor to provide support for mechanics staging panel.

Class 80. Pomp and Circumstance - The Dinner Banquet

A Functional Table (setting) for one HB p. 76. Staged in a space 32" wide x 30" deep on a 30" high table. Floral design (decorative unit) to be in scale and appropriate in size for a banquet table of eight. Decorative unit should not interfere with viewing or conversation across the table. Underlay allowed. No staging panel allowed.

Division III Education Rules

1. The NGC purpose, requirements and considerations for the Education Division are printed in the HB p. 85-86.
2. Education Exhibits must be attractively presented to instruct or inform the public in some aspect of National Garden Clubs, Inc. goals and objectives.
3. An Education Exhibit may be the work of more than one individual. However, if a Student Judge or Accredited Judge is seeking an exhibiting credit, the work must be done solely by the individual and entered accordingly.
4. There is no minimum or maximum size requirement for an Education Exhibit unless set by the schedule. To be eligible for the Educational Top Exhibitor Award, an exhibit must occupy a minimum of 18 square feet in surface area: horizontal, vertical, or a combination.
5. Committee will provide tables covered to the floor with white tablecloths. Exhibitors will provide all other staging. Staging area is one half of an 8 ft. table (48" wide x 30" deep, no height restriction). No electrical outlets available. Battery operated lighting is allowed.
6. Plant material is not required, although NGC encourages the use of plant material where appropriate.
7. The Scale of Points for Educational Exhibits is printed in HB p.130.
8. Each CAR state and National Capital Area (NCA) will be asked to provide an exhibit. The CAR state Presidents and NCA President will assign the Education Exhibit to one or more club members.

2. Botanical Arts Artistic Crafts must contain some fresh and/or dried plant material. Only dried plant material may be treated. No artificial plant material is permitted in any class. Four entries per class.
3. For Botanical Arts Artistic Crafts, Section P:
 - a. Pre-registration required by October 1, 2020 with listed Botanical Arts Design Classification Chairman.
 - b. A white unlined 3" x 5" card listing plant material must be included.
 - c. The Scale of Points for judging Artistic Crafts is printed in the HB p.131.
 - d. White table coverings

Class 83. The Ultimate Conference Tote Bag

A small/medium sized paper or cloth tote bag of exhibitor's choice appropriate for a conference tote decorated with fresh and/or dried material and optional other ornamentation. Tote is not to be used as a floral/design container. To be staged upright on a table in a space 20" wide by 15" deep. Committee to place exhibit.

Class 84. These Shoes Are Not for Walking

A pump or high heel shoe of exhibitor's choice adorned with dried and/or fresh plant material with optional other ornamentation. Shoe is not to be used as a floral/design container. Exhibitor to display shoe on a shoebox of exhibitor's choice wrapped with plain colored wrapping paper of exhibitor's choice. To be displayed on a table in a space 20" wide by 15" deep. Committee to place exhibit.

Class 85. I Want It All! - The Conference/Reunion Vendor Room

A creative display of vendor type items on a table in a space 23" wide and 29" deep. No height limitation. Underlay optional. Exhibitor may use levels or boxes to create height. Some cut plant material, fresh and/or dried, must be incorporated. Container plants in scale allowed. Exhibitor to set up exhibit before classification.
