### Luncheon Speaker: Karen Cantor – “Return”



Karen Cantor’s career has focused on the visual arts and social issues. She received a BA cum laude from Goucher College, majoring in anthropology and minoring in fine arts and two decades later received an MBA from Wake Forest University. Her first career was as an industrial and artistic photographer. She then served as a marketing director and consultant for high-tech firms, simultaneously teaching photography and entrepreneurship on the college level, first at Elon College and then American University. When Karen became a grandmother, she realized “if not now, when?” and set about to learn as much as she could about filmmaking. Her eclectic experiences have each made significant contributions to her resultant documentary films: *The Danish Solution* (2003), *Last Rights* (2009), *Invitation to the Muse* (2011), and *Return* (2018). “RETURN: Native American Women Reclaim Foodways for Health and Spirit” is a 28-minute documentary featuring charismatic Roxanne Swentzell from Santa Clara Pueblo in New Mexico. Her efforts to reclaim ancient foodways are echoed across the continent by Tlingit, Muckleshoot, Oglala Sioux, Menominee, and Seneca women. At its heart this film is about empowering people to overcome their current circumstances through eating as their ancestors did - nutritiously and locally. RETURN offers an approach to confronting the diabetes epidemic now rampant in Native American communities.

Arabella is an accredited photography judge for the Photography Society of America and is the PSA Membership Chairman for NH. Her photographs have won numerous awards in local, regional, national and international competitions. She has created, and copyright protected [www.plantipedia.com](http://www.plantipedia.com), a comprehensive on-line horticulture database of approximately 120,000 plants used by America's gardeners and conservationists. Plantipedia correlates the butterflies of North America with their plant preferences and includes many images, of plants and of butterflies, pollinator data, and plant society coding as well as information regarding the status of our native and invasive plants.

Arabella has lectured, exhibited, demonstrated, judged and taught horticulture, photography and flower arranging across the USA and abroad. She has received numerous awards for her work and is a Garden Club of America judge emeritus in Design, Horticulture and Photography.

## **Holly Shimizu: Unusual Uses for Herbs Workshop**



Holly H. Shimizu is a nationally recognized horticulturist, consultant, and educator. With a rich background in all aspects of public gardens, and a proven commitment to plant conservation and sustainability, she has been making plants and gardens more accessible and exciting to both professionals and amateurs for more than four decades.

In her career, Holly has tended and managed public gardens around the world and served as the Executive Director of the U.S. Botanic Garden for more than 14 years. In 2015, she was recognized as one of the public horticulture industry's most influential, inspirational, and pioneering individuals with The American Public Gardens Association (APGA)'s Honorary Life Member Award. Holly was instrumental in developing the Sustainable Sites Initiative (SITES) which provides professional standards for sustainability in landscape design and maintenance, and its residential counterpart, Landscapes for Life. She was a host of the popular Victory Garden show on PBS Garden for ten years and continues to lecture on a variety of topics and leads garden tours and workshops. Holly has written for numerous publications, books, and magazines, and serves on several advisory councils. She has received a number of horticultural awards from Universities, Garden associations and Honor Societies. Also, she serves as a Director on a number of Boards across our country, from Portland, Oregon to Longwood Gardens in Delaware. Her degree at Penn State was a BS in Horticulture and she received an MS from the University of Maryland.
